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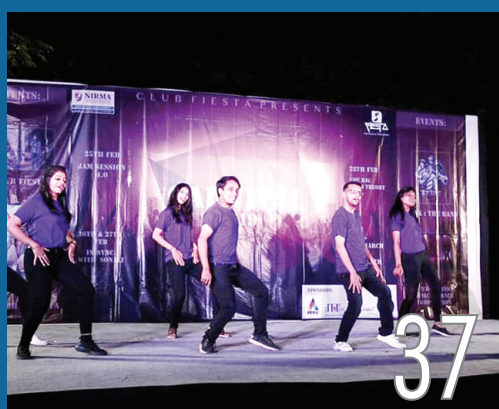
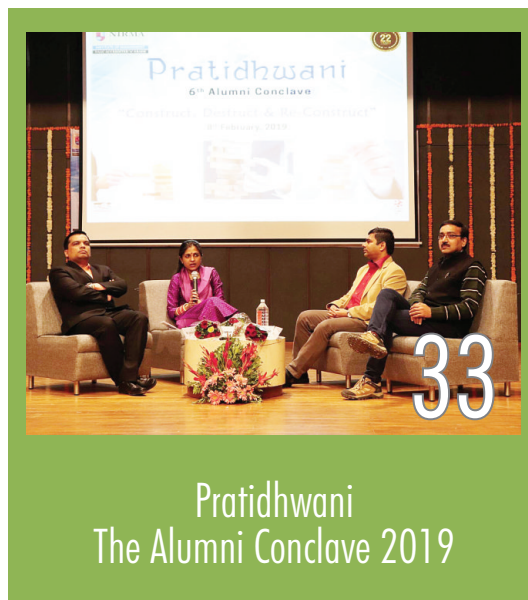

# Message from the Director General's Desk



Dear Reader,

The Draft National Education Policy (DNEP) is now put in the public domain for discussions and deliberations. It is a mammoth document, reflecting the need for deep and wide reforms in Indian education including higher education. The last education policy was released in 1986 which was further amended in 1992. It is ironical that major economic reforms were introduced in 1991 and other economic reforms were initiated from time to time. Unfortunately, higher education policy remained stagnant for a long time. During the intervening period, several commissions and committees were constituted to review higher education and make recommendations. However, the recommendations could not see the light of day. As a result, the Indian higher education system lagged behind in the comity of nations. It has to change.

India is diverse and full of contradictions. The same is true about her higher education. There are a few islands of excellence. However, most institutions are mediocre. Research is

conspicuous by absence in most higher education institutions. They just do teaching, even their quality of teaching is questionable. Thus, such institutions are lopsided and titled, often missing balance. The moot point is: can India become a great country without having a great higher education system? The answer is a big NO. Therefore, the DNEP raises fresh hope in the academic community.

The DNEP has defined the university as a multidisciplinary institution that offers undergraduate, postgraduate and doctoral education. A university should be as diverse as possible. It should offer courses in the fields of various professions, arts, humanities, and social sciences. In addition, it is engaged in both teaching and research. The Policy further posits that universities and colleges need to be categorised into research institution, teaching institution or both. Accordingly, higher education institutions should develop their mission, vision and objectives.

The DNEP underscores the role of liberal education in shaping future citizens and in enriching other educational programmes. This is a welcome step. Liberal education enlightens and empowers students. It also helps them think critically and act for social causes. It was a missing link in past education offerings. It is high time we give liberal education the place it deserves.

Accreditation is sine qua non for any educational institution. The DNEP aims at 100% accreditation of higher education institutions. This step will certainly enhance the quality of higher education. Another significant recommendation of the DNEP is

the founding of the National Research Foundation with a view to promote a vibrant ecosystem for research and innovation. Poverty of research and innovation is starkly visible in Indian universities and it must change for good. However, it is not possible without strong government support and intervention.

The proposed Policy takes cognisance of the role of private higher education institutions in promoting knowledge and innovation. In fact, more than 70% students get education in such institutions. But, they have not been adequately supported for research and innovation and faculty development. Universities – public and private – provide both private and public goods. The governments have to provide the resources to them for public goods they deliver. While public universities are compensated for providing both public and private goods, the private universities are not even supported in the delivery of public goods.

The proposed National Education Policy has several promises for students, parents, institutions, governments and society at large. In the final analysis, the success of the proposed Policy would depend on its implementation. Alas, the recommendations of various commissions and committees have hardly been implemented, resulting in a weaker higher education system. Can the nation afford to repeat such avoiding actions? It remains to be seen!

# Education and Research

## Research in Architecture

Architectural Research should happen in a systematic way in Academia as well as in practice, the twin pillar of the profession, for dual reasons of, one training the students – the future architects – and two, for advancement of the profession of architecture. It is a role assigned to us all, Institutions of architecture, schools, and architectural practices. We all need to introspect and answer truthfully whether we are doing this. I think the answer would be a resounding NO.

Let us understand that the architectural practice involves research at all stages of the work, to stay up to date to the trends, to gather data for design programmes and for site, to look at contemporary works of similar nature, to study various systems and products. Hardly any architectural practice recognises this as 'research'. It is also a fact that a large contingent of architects has no training in research and research methods. The profession as a whole has developed the habit of not recording the processes systematically or share the information generated or collected, with people, for obvious commercial or 'intellectual property' right reasons.

Architectural fraternity lives in a make believe world of 'My work is my Research'. The architects believe that their work is so different, so unique, and so individual that 'normal research' would not be possible in their field. The architect also believes so much in his/her genius that the uninteresting and mundane route of research is either avoided or not followed, or not acknowledged in the work.

In one of the position paper written by Mr Jeremy Till for RIBA Research Committee, he has stated that "The myth that architecture is just architecture, founded on the twin notion of genius and autonomy, leads eventually to the marginalization of architecture. A knowledge base is developed only fitfully and so architecture becomes increasingly irrelevant and ultimately irresponsible". When an architectural institute of long standing and reputed such as RIBA acknowledges that the act of producing good, innovative architecture, though the country has a long history and tradition of creating iconic and innovative works, is not sufficient for the advancement of the profession of architecture because it does not add to the existing data base about architecture or communicate the knowledge to people. We need to acknowledge the fact that we do not have current practices of creating good and innovative architecture nor strong system of research in India. We also do not adhere to the practice of creating acceptable, appropriate and reasonable architecture which could fit into the tested treatises of 'good' architecture.

In this vast country of diverse climate and culture we are, at best, copying the 'modern' and 'western' designs of other climate and culture proving the apprehensions expressed by Mr Jeremy Till to be true. The architectural education which is where the future architects are being trained and the future of architecture is being determined, must focus on increasing the width, breadth and depth of the knowledge base. It must focus on creating a data store and communicate the same to the academia as well as practitioner.

Architecture has its own means, ways and procedures which may not be similar to other researches. Field of architecture touches a variety of disciplines relevant or on the fringes. Research in architecture, though draws from other fields, is different from other researches, as it has to happen in academia as well as in practice concurrently. The twin pillars make the architectural research different. Individually each pillar has its pros and cons, but together it can generate useful knowledge base. To achieve this goal profession of architecture has to stop acting like a 'business'. It should stop zealously guarding the information, keeping secret, but share the knowledge continuously like a 'profession' and the institutions and schools should widen their research commitments. We also need to focus on processes rather than products. Instead of talking about individuals and buildings we need to look at the collective and comparative wisdom generated by the process.

Let us not forget that most research happens due to 'need'. The need is generated by knowledge. The knowledge is generated by systematic research. This cycle in turn generates public interest either commercial or academic, which brings in funds/finances for research. A lot needs to be done at government level, across corporations, and strategic levels, and across funding agencies level to encourage funding for research in architecture. The architectural schools are best placed to begin this important and necessary journey, for advancement of Architecture.

## Institute of Commerce Signs MoU with GIFT City

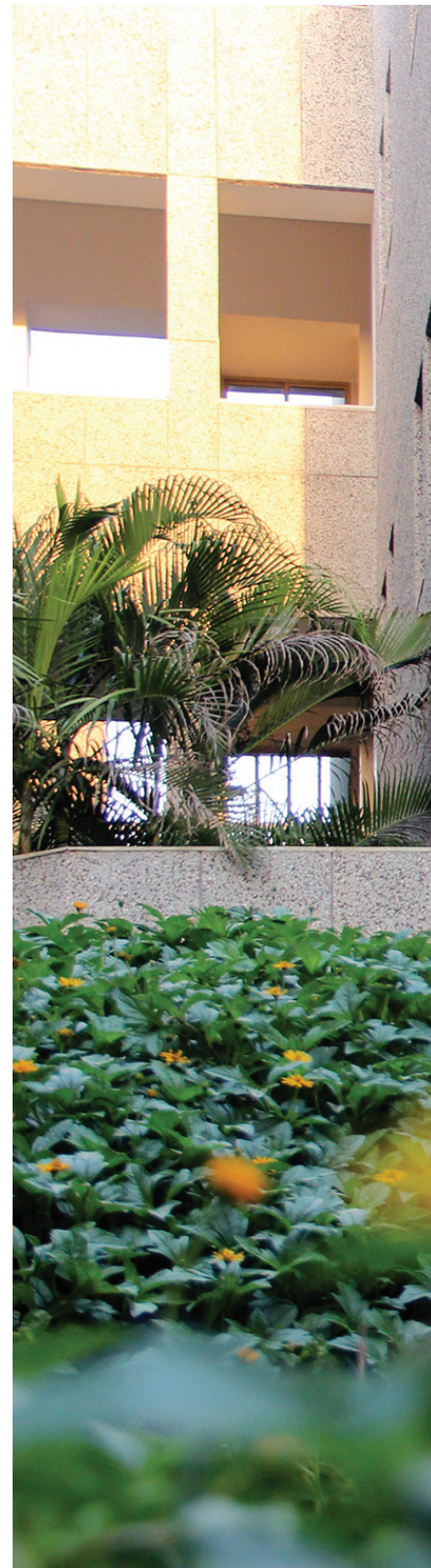

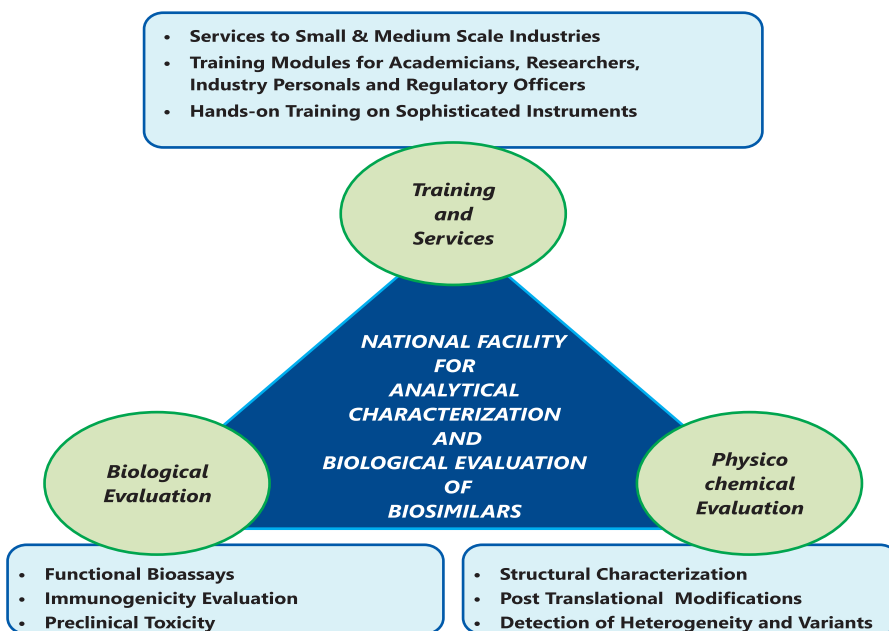

## National Facility at the University

Faculty members of Institute of Pharmacy and Institute of Science jointly received financial support of [Rs 50 million for development of national facility under DPRP Scheme](#) from Department of Science and Technology (DST), New Delhi.

The facility will assist manufacturers of drugs and biologics and will also provide technical training to industry, including large and small manufacturers and trade associations, and will respond to requests for information regarding procedures and protocols required for characterisation and evaluation of similar biotherapeutics. It will also help in development of employable talent pool in the area of biologics. The proposed facility will have adequate infrastructure to excel in the area of quantitative and qualitative analysis of biotherapeutics with hands-on experience.

Institute of Architecture and Planning has recently established a Digital Lab consisting of 3D printer and laser cutter. The 3D printer will enhance the quality of design with interesting outputs. The custom-made 3D printer will be used to construct one cubic meter of models for structure and other subjects using steel and wood with PLA (Polylactic Acid). Two material can be simultaneously used to make these models. It will also be used for architectural research on material and structural stability. The laser cutter will improve precision and save time, producing good model quality.

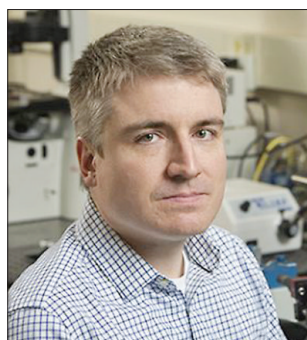

# Workshop on Demonstration & Training on Pharmaceutical Equipment and Software

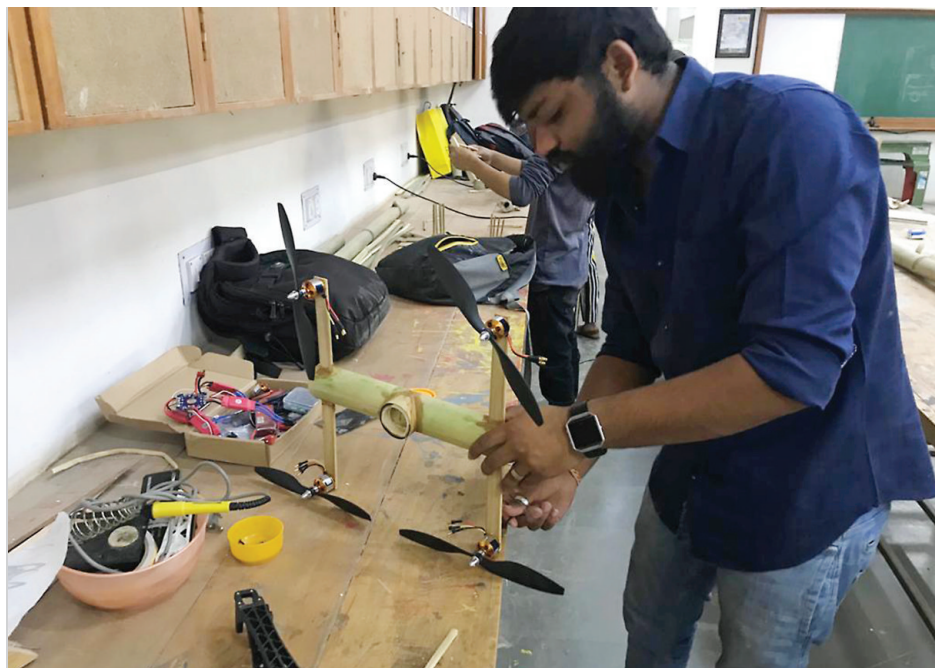

### Assessing Student Learning in Higher Education: Present Status and Future Challenges

Accreditation status to a higher education programme is considered on the basis of matching the educational requirements. It includes a review of programme content, delivery, and assessment. The teacher education programme at higher education institutes requires continuous efforts towards quality enhancement of the teaching and graduate outcomes. Use of Outcome-Based Education (OBE) and Assurance of Learning (AOL) are the key tools in effective teaching-learning and assessment. The objective of employing Outcome-Based Education in teaching-learning is to achieve high-quality outcomes.

An OBE degree programme has a distinct set of goals related to what a student is expected to learn during the programme which is known as course learning outcome. Course learning outcomes are categorised in three areas i.e. Knowledge, Skills and Application of knowledge and skills. These areas describe what students will be able to know and do by the end of the programme and attainment of the same gives measure for the AOL. AOL is an ongoing, systematic examination of student learning and the learning environment for programme improvement.

The essence of AOL is that Institute or the organisation should know about: What should every graduate know and

be able to do? (Knowledge & Skill) How the success of our development efforts is measured? (Outcome data) What will we do to improve poor outcomes? (Closing the loop)

AOL focuses on the delivery of content, course consistency, instructor availability, perceived learning for the purpose of evaluating instructor performance. Progress of the student should be mapped using the rubric tool. The rubric is scale based tool and it should be revised at regular intervals in view to improve teaching outcome. AOL can be accurately measured via direct and indirect approaches. Direct assessment acquires evidence about student learning in an environment like exams, projects, observer's evaluation, etc. whereas indirect assessment acquires evidence about how students or other stakeholders (like recruiters, academic peers, industry expert, etc) feel about learning and their learning process like surveys, interviews, focus groups, reflective essays, participation, student feedback, etc.

Assessing student learning is based on student outcome model rather than instructor-centric model. One biggest challenge is to confirm whether this model makes a difference in student's learning or not? Whatever assurance of learning assessment methods is used, it ultimately involves multiple measures over time. The use of AOL implementation in higher education is debatable as a poor outcome of the student is considered as a poor outcome of a teacher. It is a big challenge for the teachers to keep themselves updated with higher education, pedagogy, tools and techniques for its improvement.

Systematic assessment of student learning outcomes results in greater accountability by the public. AOL involves a cycle of continuous improvement of curriculum and is more focused on the knowledge and skills of students rather than faculty qualification and course content. The implementation of AOL in the programme requires the critical role of faculty. Institute must document and report their assessment activity and progress in improving student learning. There is no fixed AOL model, however, faculty can develop a model to get the desired outcome.

The systemic use of OBE and AOL require a lot of time, documentation and follow-up for an action plan. Deriving time with the diversified role of faculty as a teacher, researcher, and administrator is a great challenge.

Pringle & Michel et al. studied the OBE-AOL activities of various organisation and pointed out reasons for the resistance of faculty in its implementation for measuring the attainments of POs. The following are the reasons with clarifications on misconceptions for the same.

Time spent on developing and deploying AOL metrics

AOL analysis is difficult for the large classroom as each student is taken into consideration in the assessment. It is misunderstood that separate time will be engaged in developing metrics for assessment of learning outcome. However, assessment metrics





are already part of normal academic activities. Systematic lesson planning and drawing question paper in line of course outcome and use of suitable software could help in shortening the time.

#### Faculty fear on use of AOL for measurement of teaching performance

The target to achieve course and programme outcome is decided by the course coordinator keeping in view to match institute and examination norms. However, the poor result of course, is misunderstood as poor performance of the faculty in some organisations. Separate feedback process regarding the measurement of teaching performance can be introduced into the system to keep both AOL and performance evaluation separate from each other. Institute can create a conducive environment by inculcating good teaching practices and evaluating faculty based on teaching rather than directly student's performance. The results of AOL has to be utilised for improvement by systematic analysis.

#### Loss of academic flexibility

The success of the implementation of AOL relies on a teacher, environment and systemic approach. It is recommended to follow OBE and AOL for curriculum management but the faculty feels the loss of academic flexibility as a model remains mainly the same for each course. The use of AOL does not require any specific course in the curriculum. Hence, the Instructor has flexibility in choosing the method of teaching and using the standard rubric for reporting.

Apart from faculty resistance, structural and communication challenges, inconsistency across the various degree programme, and misalignment of vision-mission of the institute with learning goals may influence the success of AOL. Thus, these parameters are also to be taken into consideration for AOL implementation.

Accreditation agencies like NBA and NAAC give high emphasis on measuring student learning outcomes in higher education institutions to assure programme quality. Many foreign universities have adopted AOL in different programmes and they found it very effective as compared to traditionally organised programmes. However, in many Indian Universities, the same is implemented but not systematically adopted. This requires awareness among faculty for the correct use of OBE-AOL. The expert lectures should be conducted to explain this model to faculty and institute can decide strategies for taking advantage of OBE-AOL in the success of programme and course outcome. The success of the foreign university in use of OBE-AOL is attributed by providing a guideline for measurement of student learning outcome in line with the institute's vision and mission.

In conclusion, assurance of learning will go a long way towards improvement in quality teaching. Future challenges include awareness among the faculty for their ownership and identification of strategies for improving faculty engagement. The positive attitude and systematic use of this model by faculty will definitely help the organisation in quality improvement. The efforts of institute/university for environmental changes is essential for the paradigm shift of AOL from compliance to a cultivating value.

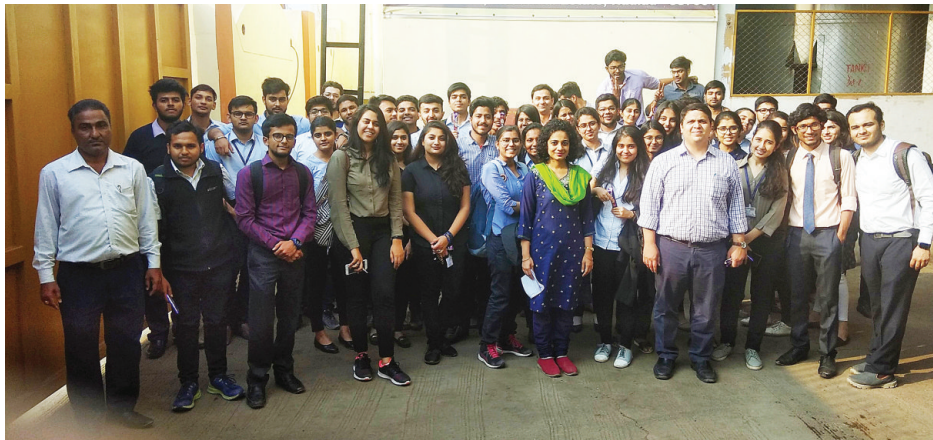




## Visit to Parle

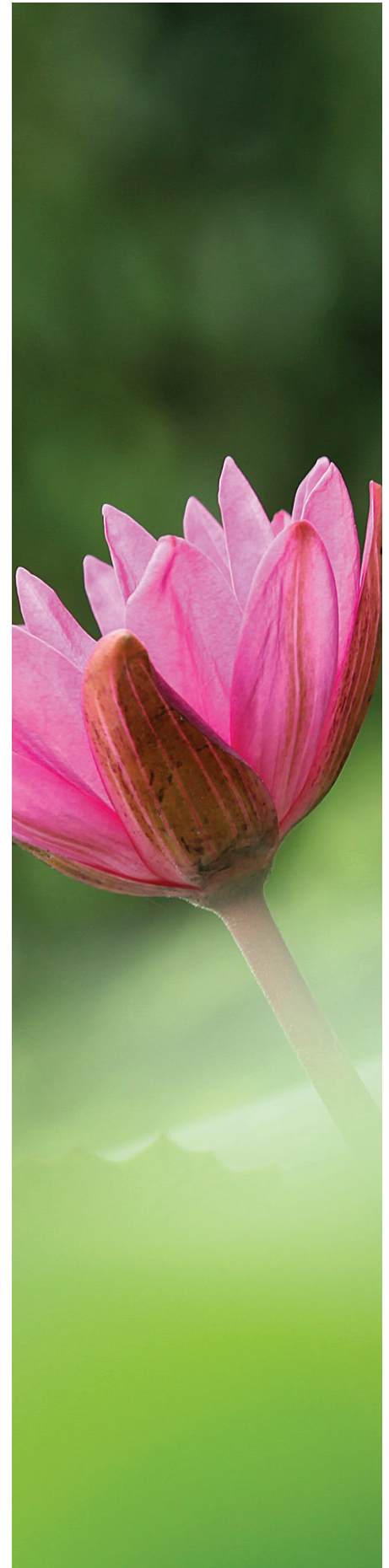

### State Level Case Analysis Competition

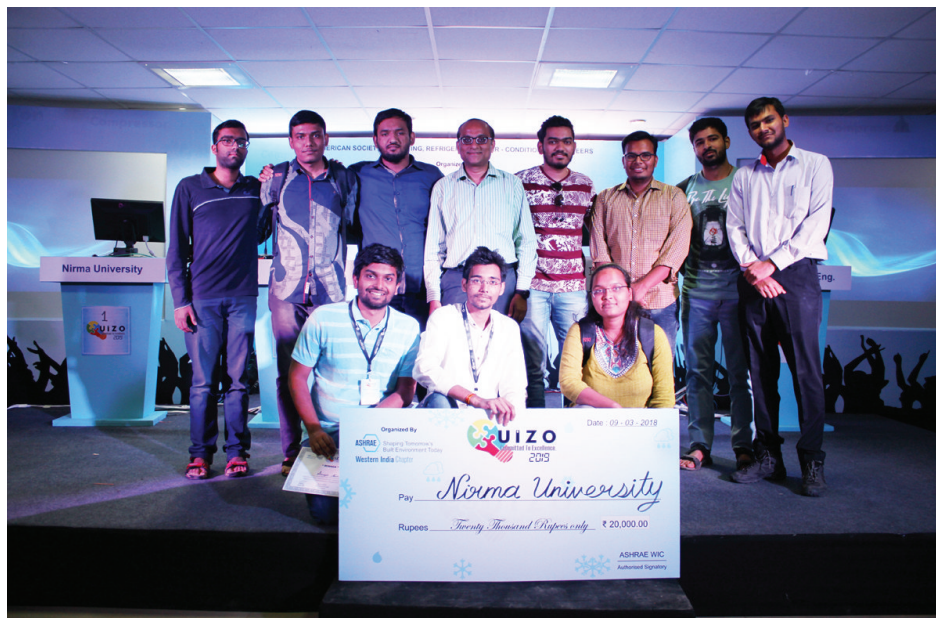

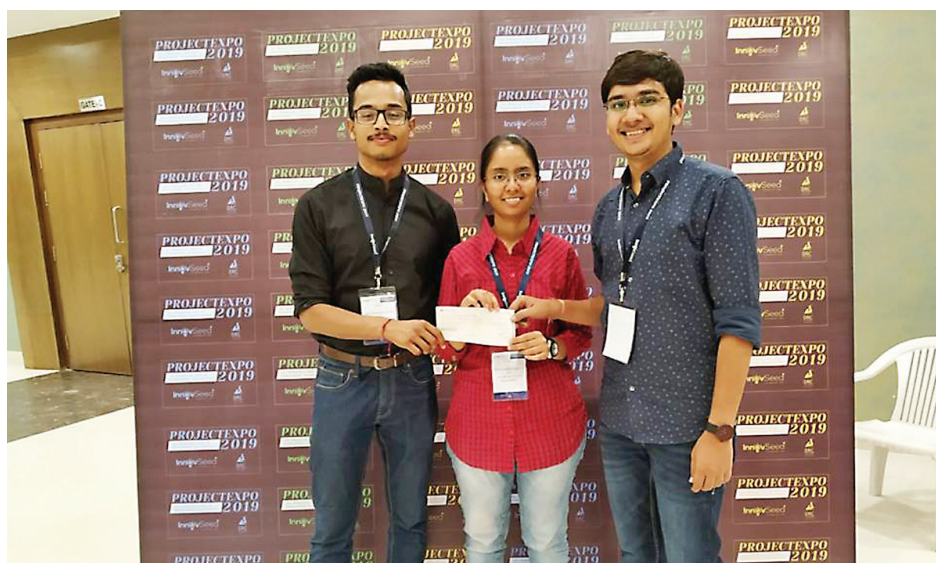
## Technical Quiz Competition
