



Message from the Director General's Desk



Dear Reader,

Higher education in India is today at a crossroads. The acceleration of higher education started about three decades ago and it is still on. As the Government of India has set ambitious target for graduate enrolment ratio, the availability of financial resources has emerged as a major obstacle in achieving this goal. Government resources are continuously shrinking and private investment in higher education is ebbing. The increase in quantity of higher education has not resulted in quality of higher education. Enrollment has gone up, academic outcomes, however, are lagging behind. This is indeed an alarming situation.

Youths are getting disillusioned with higher education as their degrees are not leading to decent employment. Corporate recruiters, on the other hand, complain that the university graduates are unable to meet their expectations. Something is rotting in the Indian higher education system. It must be diagnosed and fixed at the earliest.

There seem to be three main reasons behind the malaise of higher education in India. The first problem is related to supply of students from the school system. Most first year students do not have adequate critical thinking skills and life skills. They want to be spoon fed and are bookish. It is a tall order for higher education institutions to develop them as a critical thinker, problem solver and leader. The second problem is lack of faculty and facilities. There are not a sufficient number of teachers in higher education system. Further, many of them are poorly trained, thus they are unable to promote learning and development among students. Poor teaching results in poor learning. Laboratory and library facilities are inadequate in most institutions. Unless students spend sufficient and useful time in these facilities, they cannot hone their academic skills. Thirdly, students have minimum exposure to industry practices. The curricula are not fully integrated with industry requirements. Industry professionals are not invited for teaching and experience sharing. Internships are poorly designed and implemented. Provisions for career counselling and guidance are not well structured. As a result, students have high aspirations, but low capabilities.

Amelioration of higher education entails interventions at the government as well as institutional levels. Indian higher education is traditionally highly regulated. As the quality of teaching and learning is low, the governments find an alibi to further strengthen controls. However, they result in further poor quality. Thus, a vicious cycle of quality ensues. It is high time that governments and regulatory agencies provide greater autonomy to higher education institutions. Autonomy has to be given in financial, administrative and academic domains.

At the institutional level, high quality teaching, industry interface and achievement of learning outcomes have to be stressed. Teachers require several developmental interventions, such as training, auditing, participation in national and international conferences and interactions with subjects. Industry should be involved in each and everything that an educational institution does. Moreover, achievement of learning outcomes has to transcend beyond an accreditation exercise. I am glad to share that Nirma University rigorously follows these action steps and continuously works to assure high quality.

A Novel Chimeric-IL-15 as a promising target for Cancer Immunotherapy

The immune response induced upon administration of antigens (during the natural infection or vaccination) provide protection to host from various diseases including cancer. While antibody is very important, CD8+ T cells play a critical role in ensuring protection to host from intracellular pathogens and cancer. However, generating these T cells by subunit vaccines and maintaining the same, called memory T cells, has been a challenge.

It is well established that cytokines play a crucial role in improving the T cell responses as well as inflammation and immune attack. Amongst cytokines, Interleukin-15 (IL-15) is known to maintain the T cells, generate the memory CD8+ T cells as well as reactivate the same during challenge making it an attractive biologics to treat cancer. Hence, IL-15 is found to be responsible for deciding the fate of memory CD8+ T cells.

In cancer immunotherapy, IL-15 has been hailed as a promising immuno-oncology drug and was ranked the top potential immunotherapy agent by the National Cancer Institute (NCI/NIH), USA. It has the potential to trigger a cancer-fighting immune response, but its performance in clinical trials has raised many issues. The challenge is to make IL-15 containing drugs which will be stable and long-lasting.

Dr Sarat Dalai, Professor, Institute of Science, Nirma University along with his team took this challenge and developed a novel recombinant IL-15-containing complex called "chimeric IL-15". They have made it a highly stable biologics with > 40 hr serum half-life, Tm 78oC and dimeric in structure.

Department of Biotechnology (Basic Science Task Force), Government of India, has funded this project entitled "Development of Chimeric IL-15 to improve its bioavailability and efficacy".

Primarily, it was found that this novel chimeric IL-15 is biologically active and able to augment the generation of memory T cells induced by model antigen, OVA in mice. Its anti-tumor activity is also giving promising results in mouse melanoma cancer models. This chimeric IL-15 can be used in vaccine formulation as an adjuvant to promote the generation of antigen-specific memory CD8+ T cells targeting intracellular pathogens and cancer. The team expects that the chimeric IL-15 itself or in combination with checkpoint inhibitors will be highly effective in treating various cancers. An Indian patent was filed for this invention and has been published (Indian Patent Application No. 201721010096A).

Research News

Light weight, self-healing space suit for astronaut

Research concept to develop light weight, self-healing space suit for astronaut proposed by Dr Mamta Saiyad and Dr N M Devashrayee was submitted to Space Radiation Blue Sky workshop in Oct

2018. This concept and idea was accepted by NASA, and later presented at the Langley Research Centre in USA in Oct 2019 by Dr Mamta Saiyad.



The light weight Radiation Hardened Polymer was developed as a part of the PhD thesis work "Development and Characterisation of Radiation Hardened Epoxy Based Polymer Composite for Electronics Device Packing" by Dr Mamta Saiyad under the guidance of Dr N M Devashrayee, Professor, Electronics and Communication Department, Institute of Technology, to develop light weight, selfhealing space suit work against Radiation for astronauts.

In the present scenario, current dress worn by the astronauts weight around 13 kgs. The proposed light weight Radiation Hardened polymer will be as light as 1 kg. The reduced thickness of material will reduce the weight which will be of great help to the astronauts. Self-heal space suit will also have the mechanism to get recovered on its own if it gets damaged by Radiation in space. In addition, the proposed polymer material can absorb gamma and neutron radiation to protect astronaut under radiation environment. Dr Mamta Saiyad was the only participant from India to participate in the NASA workshop for this presentation.





Visit to Mandu





The increasing complexity of the business world and ever increasing information needs of stakeholders has led to growing demand on companies to provide information not only about their financial performance but also about their corporate governance, their impact on various stakeholder groups and their contribution towards sustainability. In addition, there are increasing needs for investors to know about various facets of the business as the financial accounting system alone fails to account perfectly for most of intangible assets generated and/or consumed by businesses and its impact on wider group of stakeholders.

The dawn of the concept of integrated reporting <IR> may be associated with the wider recognition of stakeholder theory advanced by Professor Edward Freeman (recognising a wider group of stakeholders) as opposed to the longheld shareholder theory proposed by economist Milton Friedman which focuses only on shareholders' interest.

According to Freeman's landmark work, shareholders are merely one of many stakeholders in a company. The stakeholder ecosystem, as illustrated by Dr Freeman involves anyone invested and involved in, or affected by, the business enterprise. This includes employees, environmentalists near the company's plants, vendors, governmental agencies, suppliers, customers and more.

Integrated Reporting: the changing face of Financial Reporting

Freeman's theory suggests that a company's real success lies in satisfying all its stakeholders, not just those who might profit from holding its ownership. This realisation that the long term survival and competitiveness of an organisation depends on wellbeing of a wider group of stakeholders not just shareholders, paved the way for new tools and techniques including Integrated Reporting, to be used by stewards to ensure that they do justice with this all-encompassing responsibility assigned to them.

During the past two decades, the initiatives such as: 1999 PWC Value Reporting Framework, adoption of integrated sustainability reporting by South African Governance Code, 2003 release of the "Indicators That Count" report by the Business Impact Review Group, and the Prince's Accounting For Sustainability Project of 2007; may be identified as major forces that paved the way for 2009 foundation of International Integrated Reporting Committee (IIRC) by those attending the Prince's Accounting for Sustainability Forum meeting. South Africa was again on forefront setting up an Integrated Reporting Committee (IRC) aimed to develop guidelines on integrated reporting. All these initiatives culminated into the December 2013 release of The Integrated Reporting <IR> Framework.

According to a PWC report "Integrated Reporting <IR> is a framework that applies principles and concepts focused on bringing improved cohesion and efficiency to the corporate reporting process. IR allows a business to tell its value creation story in a cohesive and holistic manner and ultimately enables efficient and productive allocation of capital".

<IR> is expected to raise awareness and motivate organisations to actively manage a wider range of resources for value creation. Intangible assets including natural and human capital intellectual capital, research and development, brand value, are expected to be viewed with the same lens by organisation following <IR> framework. This change in approach is going to improve the value creation potential of organisations.

Making a strong case for <IR>, an EY report states that, "Financial reports fail to reflect an organization's ability to create value in the short, medium and long term through efficient management of its strategic resources". The report further states that an organization's value is decreasingly derived from the tangible assets on its balance sheet and increasingly from its intangibles. The weight of tangible to intangible assets has inverted over the last three decades. According to IIRC Framework an integrated report should not only provide the historical information but also forward looking information on issues including but not limited to organisation's overview and operating context, risks it faces and competitive advantage it enjoys due to opportunities that exist, governance structures and styles, its business model, strategy that it applies in short, medium and long term, past performance and the future outlook.

Companies such as the Crown Estate, SAP, Novo Nordisk, Port of Rotterdam Authority, Natura, Anglo American, Aegon are some of the pioneers known for early adoption of Integrated Reporting Framework. The major influences behind the popularity of integrated reporting in India during the past decade include the Companies Act 2013



and the SEBI guidelines including those related to Corporate Social Reporting and Business Responsibility Reporting. The changing mind set of corporate India is expected to promote the initiatives such as <IR> in a big way.

Like any other initiative, the <IR> initiative should also be taken with a pinch of salt as there is no scientifically proven evidence about its effectiveness yet. Interestingly a qualitative content analysis of the <IR> disclosed by the French companies in the period of 2013–16 reveals that information asymmetry is not reduced since companies mention only some capitals as inputs to their value creation process while almost entirely excluding natural capital. Moreover, companies disclose only positive information mainly about their financial capital, without mentioning any destruction of capital, especially not the natural one. Similarly, a study conducted in Thailand reveals that companies with good corporate governance awards are those disclosing information required by <IR> framework, however, the quantity of information provided is minimal. To summarise, while, I personally remain optimistic about the change <IR> is going to bring, it is still too early for the corporate world to conclude whether the <IR> will be able to deliver the intended results as speedily and effectively as envisaged by its advocates.

You and many of your classmates will have inspiration to become doctors and serve others".

I wonder what training this mother had received or was it because she did not receive formal training!
