


The epitome of rustic heritage, House 1990 is a residence in the very narrow yet cosy street of Jada Bhagat Ni Pol, opposite Chipa Ni Pol. This three storied building was constructed in 1872.

The house facade embodies simplicity and is surrounded by houses adjacently on both the longitudinal sides. Two streets run parallel along the front and back of the house.

The House 1990 is shaded by the house in front of it and the major source of light- the courtyard, lets the light in.

Small changes like painting of walls and roof maintenance in the drawing room and store room on the first floor were done recently and as such no major renovation was done to the house.

The current residents, a joint family of 9 members, have inherited this house by their ancestors who also built it. They run a pant shop and use the less approachable areas of house as store room for the goods.























Ground Floor Plan























Exploded Isometric





A chawk which almost centres the pol is a gathering space of people. The usual lifestyle of people starts around 9 am when the people leave for work, the kids go to the school and the housewives and elderly do the house chores. The most common place for the women here to talk is the oatla and the chawk. The oatla facilitates as shaded seating and the chawk provides as a parking space for the residents and the people who come here.

Owners and Usage pattern of the house: The residents belong to a marvadi family which is branched into 9 members: An elderly couple who own the house, their two sons and their respective families.

Occupation and activity: The elderly couple is unemployed and usually help in the house chores with the housewives. The two sons run a business of selling pants to shops and use the less approached places of the house as storage places of the goods. Their kids go to the same school everyday from 8 am to 1 pm.

As the courtyard is the major source of light and ventilation, daily activities and gatherings take place around it.

Three sides of the courtyard are surrounded by windows while fourth side has a railing and the path along it was primarily used for movement but is inaccessible now because of the storage goods around the path.

The floors have been divided in a way that each family lives on one floor. The rooms on the first and second floor are used as storage place of the goods.

The roof covers the courtyard so a small longitudinal cutout on the roof provides some amount of light. The roof is accessible by staircase. The kids fly kites and play on the roof. During monsoon, the residents cover the cutout with a corrugated sheet which prevents water from coming inside.
