Introduction:

- The Disable Welfare Trust of India was formed in 1991 by Kanubhai Hasmukhbhai Tailor, a physically disabled person who suffered permanent disability to his legs due to poliomyelitis he contracted at the age of eleven. The primary aim of the organisation was to provide education and vocational training to the disabled children and work for their rehabilitation.
- The activities during the initial years were limited due to paucity of funds but Tailor conducted a survey where he identified 1280 disabled children. A chance meeting, in 1997, with the then Police Commissioner of Surat, P. C. Pande and S. R. Rao, the Municipal Commissioner, helped the trust to get 10 rooms in a primary school. Here, Kanubhai started a school, on 1 July 1957, with the financial assistance of 51,000 from Pande. Starting with four children, the trust grew to a student strength of 118 by the year end, and provided free transportation, educational aids, lunch and physiotherapy treatment to them.
- In 2000, the school moved to a larger facility with 18 rooms given by the Municipal corporation at Khatodara, Surat and the student strength grew to 400. Later, on a free land measuring 4500 square yards, a new facility was constructed in 2006, the

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foundation stone laid by the then Vice President of India, Bhairon Singh Shekhawat and the construction completed with the assistance of Reliance Industries and Larsen and Toubro. The trust claims that the project is a success with many students going on to complete various professional degrees in management, engineering and medicine.

INSPIRATION:

The Evolution of this Organization revolves around the spirit, dream and vision of one man, Kanubhai Tailor the numero uno of this institution, whose singular effort has transformed the lives of many physically challenged humans of the city, State and Nation. Paralyzed by Polio in both his legs he had to literally drag himself to the school, for his basic education and for his further studies. During his stint at the college he came across many like bodied persons who narrated their sufferings from the society and the perfunctory attitude of the State Government towards the disabled. Having heard about their miseries, Kanubhai decided to fight for justice by knocking the doors of the society and the Government and to make them understand their responsibilities.

MAJOR ACTIVITIES HELD IN PAST :

- In 1978 all types of services were rendered to the handicapped in Ahmedabad. The needy were distributed tricycles and given scholarships. With a view of removing their inferiority complex, a cycle rally and various cultural programmes were organized.
- Got an opportunity to be a part of the Indian delegate for the Sixth Mobility International World Conference, Geneva, Switzerland in 1979. Seeking blessings from Hon. PM Morarjibhai Desai before his visit.
- Also visited U.K., France, Ireland, Kuwait, South Africa, Kenya in 1979 along with the Mobility International delegates, to study the problems of the handicapped.
- In 1983, went on a fast for 11 days for getting relief for the handicapped and reservation of the seats in S.T. bus. Also formed a committee for this. Nearly 3.5 lakhs handicapped were benefited by his efforts.
- In 1985, started Viklang Bandu Printing Press with an intention to train the Physically Challenged for their self sustenance. Every year ten Compositor Printers, book binders and proof readers were trained & absorbed at different places. All these efforts were made to give training to maximum number of handicapped.
- In 1986, ten handicapped were allotted cabins for selling cold-drinks in association with Surat Beverages Pvt. Ltd. & Surat Municipal Corporation. He also managed to arranged telephone booths for five handicapped persons with the help of the Dept. of Telecommunication.
- More than 1000 trees were planted in the city of Surat by Disable Welfare Trust of India in association with the Municipal Corporation.
- In 1989, responsibility of celebrating World Handicapped Day was handed over to Trust by the Dist. Collector in which seminars, camps, recruitment functions, self employment camp for Blind/Deaf & Handicapped person were organized in which more than 1000 Handicapped participated & 75 were helped to get a job.
- Handicapped Welfare Federation, New Delhi organized a National Sports in which Gujarat State Handicapped participated & won many prizes.
- In 1995, 4% reserved seats for job was arranged by the Trust in

Reliance, Kribhco, Essar Steel Companies, Hazira, Surat & more than 25 presons got employed.

- Arranged cold-drinks stall for more than 100 handicapped in association with Surat Beverages Co. & Fixed Rs. 2/- as profit margin per bottle from the company.
- Trust also took initiative to provide loan Rs. 10,000/- to 60,000/- at 4% interest from Prime Co.Op. Bank, Surat.
- On the World Handicapped Day Tricycle Rally was arranged in Surat city to justify that the handicapped of the Societies needed love.
- In 1997
 - ✓ A survey of the slums in Surat city was conducted by the Disable Welfare Trust of India. About 1280 Children were identified to be handicapped, illiterate and living below poverty line. The Trust took the responsibility to provide them free education.
 - ✓ A handicapped school (Primary Section) std. I to VII with 120 children was established in a 10 room building allotted by Surat Municipal Corporation.
 - ✓ All the 120 Handicapped Children were provided free note books, pen, pencils, school Uniforms, Lunch Boxes, School Bags, Breakfast, Transportation service. They are taught computer training, Small scale industries training & Physiotherapy treatment also. Calipers, tricycles and wheel chairs are provided to the deserving students. Each student is given scholarship of Rs.500/- annually by the Trust. Apart from this the Trust provided free education to all the students even though the school in not aided by a Govt. grant.
- The Trust arranged intercaste marriage of a handicapped couple.
- In 2002,
 - ✓ For the first time in India Handicapped students participated in an Air Rifle shooting competition which was arranged by the Trust in the school premises in which most of the students participated.
 - ✓ As a part of Self-employment, a separate tuition center was opened by the trust and 5 female handicapped took classes in

this center and earned their bread and butter. This center was opened by Shri Hemantbhai Chapatwala, Hon'ble Minister for Law & Justice of Gujarat.

- In 2003,
 - ✓ 6th International Abilympics was organized at Indira Gandhi stadium, New Delhi during 26 to 29, November 2003. Abilympics was inaugurated by Shri Atalbihari Vajpayee, Hon'ble Prime Minister of India, Shri A.P.J. Abdul Kalam, Hon'ble President of India, including renowned dignitaries of Nation and the representative from 32 countries also participated. As a member of Governing Body of above mentioned ceremony, the function was well planned and managed by Kanubhai.
- **Ambulance distribution** and Rs.11,00,000/- donation for new school by Shri P K Johari Chief of ONGC Hazira and officers of ONGC and Shri Kanubhai Tailor on Aug. 2005.
- Artificial limbs, calipers, camp was organized where 1000 students were checked up and needy students were given crutches and calipers by Shri Kanubhai Mavani Mayor, Surat, Dr.Parfulbhai Siroya President Lokdrashti Eyebank, Mr.Pradip Anjariya, Mr.Pujabhai CT Mehata Rehab Centre, Baroda on July.2006.
- “Prabhu General Hospital” the new venture by the Disable Welfare Trust of India, for the welfare of the differently abled, being inaugurated by the Honorable Chief Minister of Gujarat Shri Narendrabhai Modi on the 25th of January 2011.
- The program ‘Clean Surat’ was sponsored by SMC.As a part of it teachers, students with Mr. Patel cleaned the Halpati colony of village Umara. Mr. Patel flagged off the rally to bring awareness among the people of the village.The students drive for cleanliness was lead by Mr. R J Patel (Deputy Commissioner, SMC) and Pallaviben on 02/10/2013.

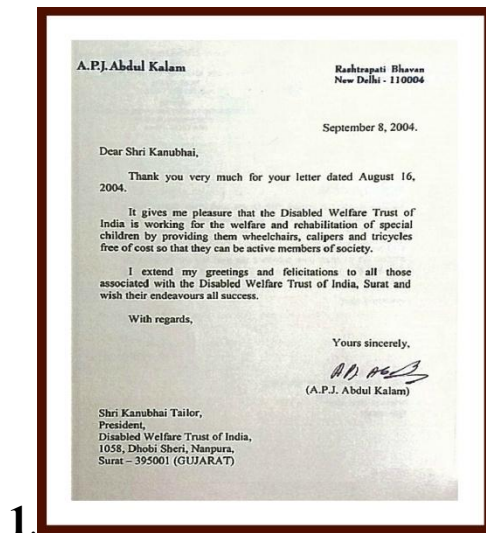
MISSION:

The Trust has been awarded the Best Institute award from the Govt. of Gujarat while Kanubhai in appreciation of his noble deeds for the disadvantaged section of the society, has received the Padmashri -2011 Award and various other recognitions.

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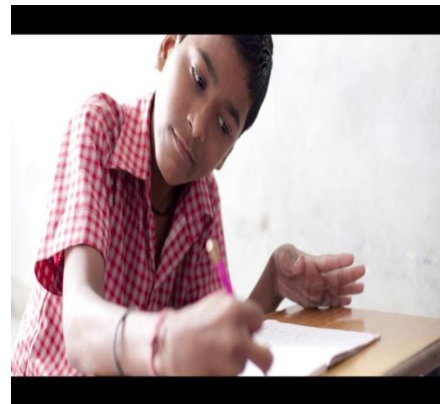
