

INTRODUCTION

YUVA Unstoppable is a non-governmental organization in India. It works to provide education to the underprivileged children, Sanitation, Drinking Water, Youth Affairs, cleanliness and involving them in various non-curricular activities. The organization is spread across 30 cities in India, with 1,50,000 volunteers.

Yuva Unstoppable is a movement, their slogan is- A Tide/A force that is breaking down barriers of social inequality and creating a tangible roadmap for the betterment of society. Their aim is to make a difference in the lives of children at the bottom of the economic pyramid. Co-founded by Amitabh Shah in 2005, it has today worked with over 1.5 Lac youth ambassadors and volunteers to impact over 6 lac children across 1500 government schools in about 14 states of the country.

VISION

Their vision is to “TRANSFORMING 10,000 Schools, Impacting 5,00,000 Children and awarding 10,000 scholarships, in the next 5 years. To enhance self-belief, Gratitude, and compassion of children and all the stakeholders.”

HISTORY

It was founded and directed by Amitabh Shah in 2005. In 2010, it commenced their operations in Vadodara, Gandhinagar and Surat. By 2011 it had operations in 30 cities in India and had launched in Rajasthan.

On World Toilet Day 2016, India hosted the first Global Citizen Festival outside of New York City. Government of Maharashtra, Hindustan Unilever Limited, and Yuva Unstoppable together made commitments which will affect 55.96 crore (559.56 million) lives by 2030.

MISSION

The mission was to help the youth become kinder by adopting the 'pass it on' concept. YUVA provides a platform for the volunteers and involve them in doing random acts of kindness. It aims at inspiring people to change the world by being kind.

INITIATIVES

School Sanitation

They took initiative in bringing cleanliness in schools where the underprivileged children study. In Taalim O Tarbiyat, Bandra's Anjuman Islam, Dr Mohammed Ishaq Jamkhanawala Girls High School and Junior College in Mumbai got 39 new toilets built for its 2,600 students; built by Yuva Unstoppable and Zafar Sareshwala education movement.

Co-Working with Rakeysh Omprakash Mehra, Yuva Unstoppable built around 800 toilets in 4 years in Mumbai and Gujarat.

School Supplies

Through YUVA Unstoppable, Municipal school children get books, pens, pencils and other stationery items from private schools.

YUVA does not charge participants in its programmes.

Covid-19

Yuva Unstoppable started the Janta Mentorship program to provide scholarships for online mentorship sessions and providing food to the needy during the lockdown.

REVIEWS

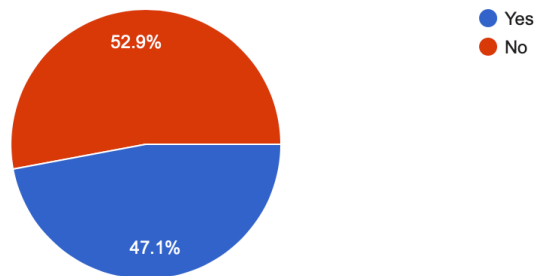

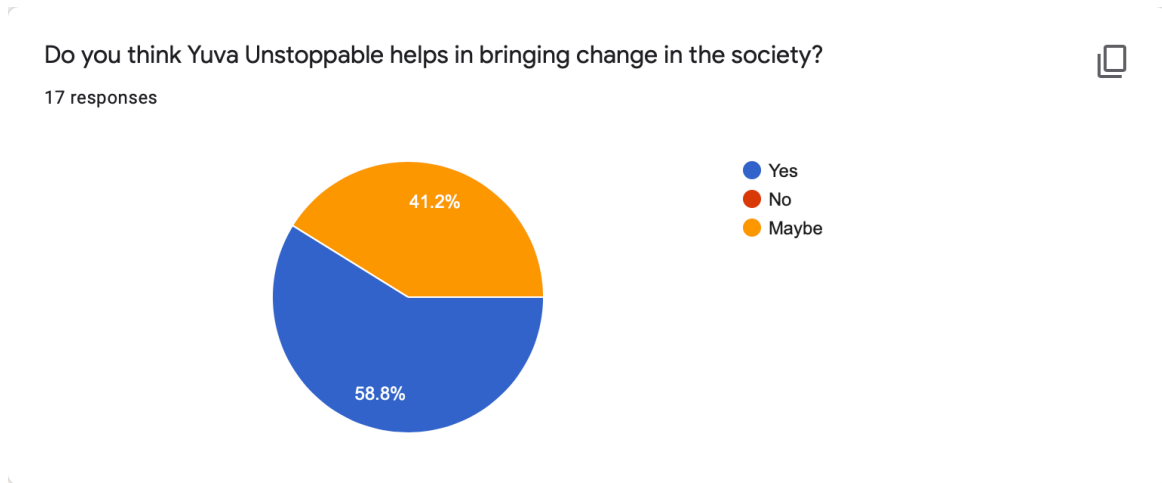
These responses shows almost 52.9% do not know about this organisation.

Do you know about Yuva Unstoppable as an NGO?

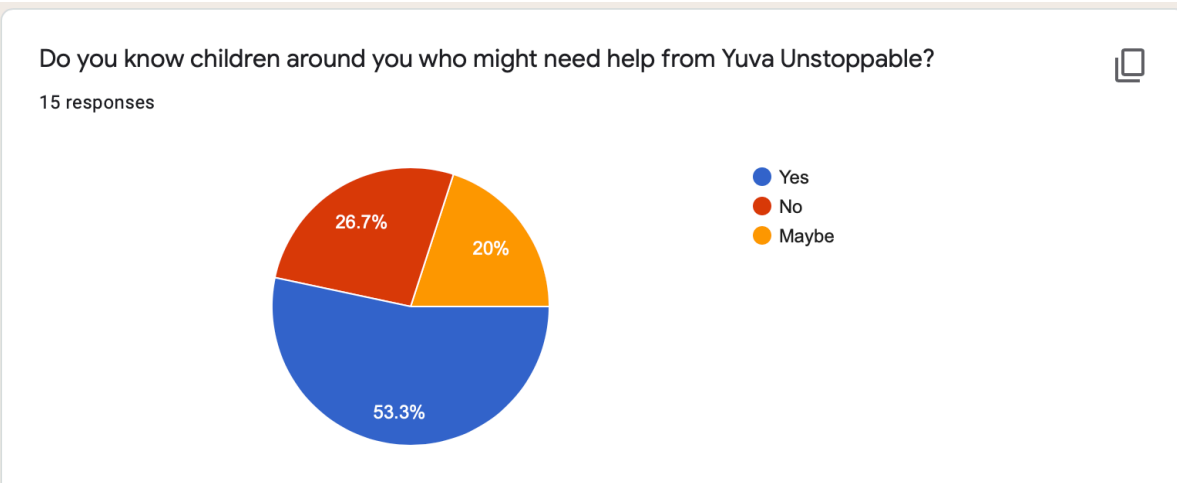

From the survey we can tell that everybody thinks YUVA UNSTOPPABLE brings change to the society.



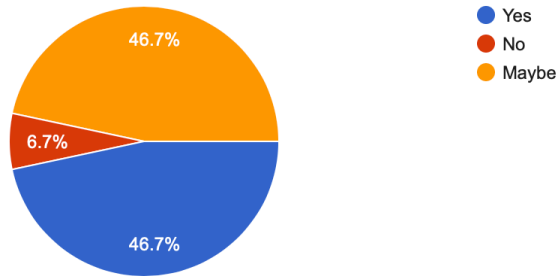
From this survey almost everyone knows poor children around them who might need YUVA Unstoppable's help.

Would you like to donate to Yuva Unstoppable and educate the underprivileged children ?

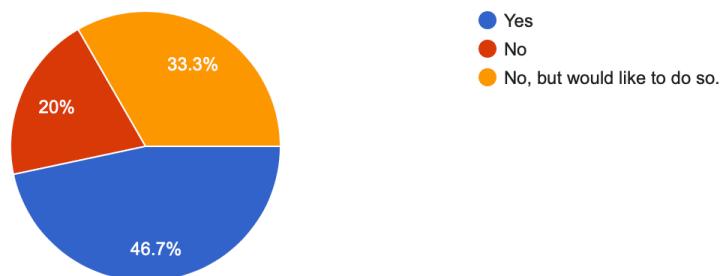

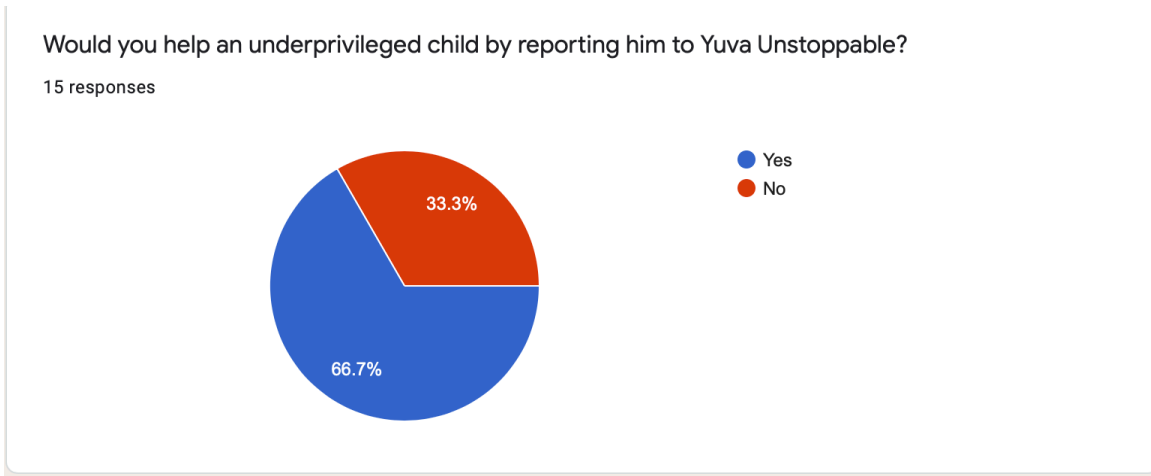

Have you ever independently helped Underprivileged Children with education? (eg. paying for their school fees, etc.)

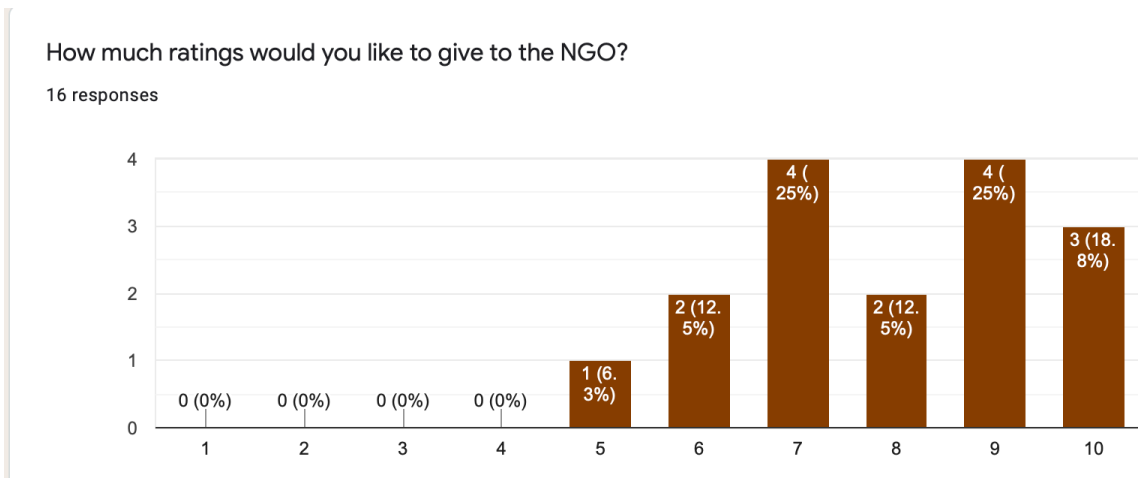

These are the ratings given to the YUVA UNSTOPPABLE organisation (non governmental organisations) which were expectedly high.




SUGGESTIONS:

Many people in the survey suggested the NGO to look upto other societal problems like Abolishing Casteism, increasing awareness towards nature.

1. Coordination with banks at central level for seamless and automatic education loans without reference to parents' income.
2. Lobbying for minimal interest rates for education loans. At present they are more than non essentials like vehicle loans.
3. Lobbying for rationalised fees structure in education so as to minimise the commercialisation of education.
4. Help evolve a system like continuous guarantee of future loanees and/or stamping of loan outstanding on degree certificate/ passport to avoid defaults.

Many other suggestions were stated related to the societal problems.
