

LEGAL STATUS OF LGBTQIA++ COMMUNITY IN INDIA

"HISTORY OWES APOLOGY TO THE LGBT COMMUNITY FOR THEIR SUFFERINGS." - HON'BLE MRS JUSTICE INDU MALHOTRA

On September 6, 2018, India's Supreme Court ruled that consensual homosexual acts would no longer constitute a crime. The historic move reversed Section 377 of the Indian Penal Code which was a legacy from British colonial rule. The change was welcome by Indian and global LGBTQ+ communities as a step towards acceptance and equal rights.

The Supreme Court in its judgment only held that consensual homosexual sex could not be a crime under the Indian Constitutional scheme. The judgment was therefore limited in its scope. Of course, the signalling by the Court that it was on the side of the queer community had a positive force in the discourse about sexuality in public spaces. The statement of legal principles - that a queer person is entitled to the full protection of the laws without any discrimination by the state - has also helped lay the foundation for future challenges to other discriminatory laws. There is, however, a very long way to go. The Parliament has passed the Transgender Persons (Protection of Rights) Act, 2019 which is very problematic as it does not allow for self-determination of transgender status. The Act also does not offer the reservations in public employment and education as had been directed by an earlier Supreme Court judgment. The Act has been challenged in the Supreme Court and there is an urgent need to remedy its more draconian provisions.

India does not have a comprehensive anti-discrimination code. While the Constitution prohibits discrimination, that injunction only applies to the government and its instrumentalities. The private sector thus can discriminate with impunity in matters of employment, housing, health and education among other areas. While there is a discussion about the need for such a law, there appears to be very little political consensus towards the enactment of such a law. Even the courts have not yet woken to this problem which materially affects the lives of the queer community.

The Color Purple is a 1982 epistolary novel by American author Alice Walker which won the 1983 Pulitzer Prize for Fiction. This is not simply a story of a girl, Celie, but many more like her, who are oppressed, dominated and humiliated and how they are forced to accept the identity of silence over words. The novel powerfully addresses the issue where a woman's will, choices, ability to think and live by her own ways is snatched away from her, and then it more powerfully portrays their(women's) journey from being an object to a subject.



Boy Erased : A Memoir by Garrard Conley



In "Boy Erased," Garrard Conley tells a haunting account about his childhood in a fundamentalist Arkansas family that forced him to undertake conversion therapy. After Conley was outed as gay in college, he was given a choice: be disowned or go through complete conversion therapy - a practice widely discredited as ineffective and harmful by medical practioners. Conley recounts his participation in the months-long program in this 2016 memoir, with the hope of spreading awareness about the psychological warfare inflicted on those subjected to the practice. "Boy Erased" was adapted into a 2018 film, starring Lucas Hedges and Nicole Kidman.


Into the sky with Pride forever
