International Teaching Month

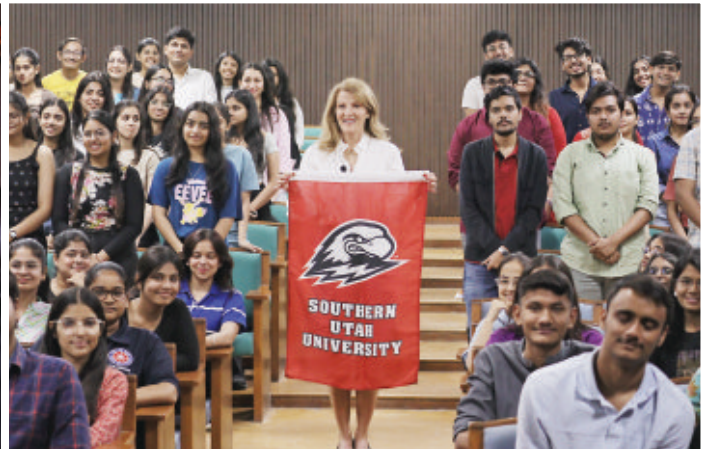
The Institute of Law, Nirma University successfully organized the International Teaching Month from February 15 to March 15, 2025, featuring distinguished scholars and professionals from across the globe through both physical and virtual sessions.

Dr. Ricky Lee, Senior Lecturer at the University of Canterbury, New Zealand, offered a certificate course on Air and Space Law, covering international air law, state liability, and the Chicago Convention. He also led a session on Cross-Border Mergers, analyzing merger strategies and control mechanisms in Australia and the EU. Dr. Andras Hars, Senior Lecturer at Ludovika University of Public Service, Hungary, delivered a course on AI and Law, discussing AI's interaction with legal systems, human rights, and intellectual property. He also spoke on International Responsibility under public international law and addressed Sexual Exploitation and Abuse in UN Peace Operations. Dr. Adam Dubin, Professor at Comillas Universidad Pontifica, Spain, explored human rights in criminal justice, fair trial standards, and international obligations. His lectures on Gender and Law focused on the Convention on the Elimination of Discrimination against Women and abortion rights developments in the USA.

Prof. Venkat Iyer, Senior Lecturer at Ulster University, Ireland, addressed Hate Speech in Indian Elections, offering legal and constitutional insights. His session on Clashing Human Rights examined the tensions between rights, while his talk on Ethics in Modern Media addressed current media challenges. Dr. Ylli Dautaj, Visiting Associate Professor at Penn State Law, USA, conducted sessions on Investment

Treaty Arbitration, focusing on ISDS, international treaty impacts, and evolving arbitration trends. Prof. Brendan Bernicker, Visiting Assistant Professor of Law at Penn State Law, led a session on Legal Advice for Startups, covering key legal considerations for businesses. He also explored Artificial Intelligence and Personality Rights, discussing AI's role in IP and publicity rights.

Judge Keith Barnes of the Fifth District Court, Utah, USA, critically examined the American Judiciary, addressing judicial independence, political pressure, and capital punishment debates. He also analysed the Separation of Powers in the U.S., discussing executive overreach and legislative gridlock. Prof. Nina Barnes, Adjunct Professor at Southern Utah University, USA, delivered lectures on Identity Politics, examining the impact of global conflicts on gender, race, and class roles. A panel discussion on Careers in Law featured Judge Keith Barnes, Dr. Jyotsana Yagnik, Dr. Venkat Iyer, Prof. Brendan Bernicker, Dr. Ylli Dautaj, and Dr. Anviksha Pachori, moderated by Dr. Stephen Barnes. The panelists shared personal career journeys, challenges, and advice for aspiring legal professionals.

The International Teaching Month enriched students with global legal perspectives and facilitated meaningful academic exchanges with international experts.

14th Anti-Trust Moot Court Competition

The Institute of Law, Nirma University, hosted the 14th ILNU Antitrust Moot & Conference, on February 21–23, 2025. The event, held in collaboration with the CCI, brought together experts in competition law and featured a moot court competition with 24 teams from across India, showcasing exceptional advocacy skills.

The event aimed to enhance students' advocacy abilities and provide a platform for talent display. The inauguration on February 21 featured the unveiling of the official banner and was graced by esteemed dignitaries, including K.K. Patel (Founder President, Nirma Education and Research Foundation), Anup K. Singh (Director General, Nirma University), Dr. Madhuri Parikh (Dean, ILNU), Andras Hars (National University of Public Service, University of Szeged), along with department heads and distinguished faculty members.

The drafting team behind the Moot Proposition comprised Mr. Mohith Gauri, and Mr. Ojasvi Mishra, both esteemed professionals associated with AZB & Partners. Their expertise in competition law and experience in legal practice ensured the creation of a challenging and comprehensive problem for the competition, setting the stage for participants to demonstrate their advocacy skills effectively.

The event was supported by esteemed partners, including the Competition Commission of India (CCI) as the Title Partner. Established in 2003 under the Competition Act of 2002, CCI promotes fair competition and collaborates with institutions like ILNU to nurture legal talent through internships, events, and advocacy.

Conference on Economic Offences

The Institute of Law, Nirma University organized the 1st Nirma University Mock Trial Competition (NMTC) and Conference on Economic Offences from March 28–30, 2025. The event commenced with a traditional lamp lighting ceremony, followed by a welcome address by Dr. Madhuri Parikh, Dean and Director, ILNU, who stressed the importance of understanding economic offences in today's legal landscape. Retd. Justice P.B. Majumdar, Former Judge, Gujarat High Court, delivered the inaugural address, emphasizing judicial accountability, ethical practice, and the role of young lawyers in shaping a just society. The event was further graced by Prof. Anup K Singh, Director General, Nirma University, Retd. Judge Jyotsana Yagnik, former Principal District Judge and legal scholar, and Shri Ajay Kumar Tomar, Retired Police Commissioner, who shared crucial insights on the law enforcement perspective in economic offences.

Panel I, themed "White Collar Crimes in India: Technological and Legal Challenges," was moderated by Mr. Rachit Khamparia, Advocate, Bombay High Court, and featured speakers Mr. Jai Anant Dehadrai, Advocate-on-Record, Supreme Court of India, Ms. Tanya Ganguli, Principal Associate, Panag and Babu, and Mr. Jayant Bhatt, Founder, Chambers of Jayant Bhatt. The panel explored corporate frauds like the Satyam scandal, challenges in prosecuting cybercrimes like money laundering via cryptocurrency and ransomware attacks (e.g., the Colonial Pipeline incident), and the critical role of forensic technology and digital evidence. Discussions promoted reform in corporate governance, forensic auditing, and investigative practices to ensure transparency.

Panel II, themed "Procedural Aspects of PMLA and Victim Restitution," was moderated by Dr. Alaukik Shrivastava, Assistant Professor, ILNU, and included Adv. Gautam Khazanchi, White-Collar Crime & Commercial Litigation Expert, Adv. Monark Gahlot, Partner, Cyril Amarchand Mangaldas, and Adv. Rahul Tyagi, Criminal Lawyer, Delhi High Court & Supreme Court. The panel discussed the functioning of the Enforcement Directorate (ED), procedures of property attachment and restoration with examples like Vijay Mallya, Nirav Modi, Mehul Choksi, and Bhushan Power and Steel Ltd., and trial procedures under the PMLA, covering the jurisdiction of special courts, burden of proof, and bail conditions. Emphasis was placed on balancing investigative authority with judicial fairness and ensuring victim restitution.

The event greatly enhanced students' legal acumen by bridging theory with practice. Through interactions with seasoned experts, students developed critical thinking, gained advanced investigative techniques, and were empowered to approach economic offences with innovation and integrity.

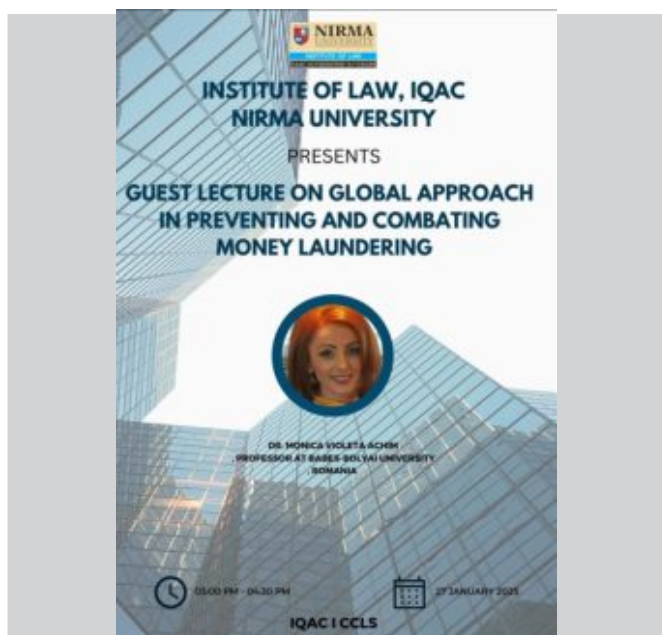


Expert Lecture on "Global Approach in Preventing and Combating Money Laundering"
