#### Basics:

#### A Work by Three or More Authors:

- Use the first author’s surname followed by "et al."
- Example: (Gutierrez et al., 2019).

#### Two or More Works:

- Separate citations with a semicolon.
- Example: (Chen, 2020; Mills, 2019).
